Volunteer Activities - During the year volunteers have been engaged in a number of activities including creating; new log piles, planters, wildflower areas, bog and rain gardens, a composter, and maintaining all the additions to the Square from the beginning of the project.

A significant additional facility in the Square during the year was the installation of a large, 2000 litre, water butt. Thanks to Peter, Richard, Jimmy from All Saints, and Howard for enabling this. We hope during 2023, in partnership with Vale Council, to have mains water connected to the Square, in the form of a drinking fountain.

A big thank you to our volunteers on Saturday mornings, and other occasions for creating new features and maintaining the Square. Here's what some of them have said about their experiences.



''I started volunteering in January this year and since then have been involved in many different projects and I have learnt loads!

Most recently I have been involved with creating the bog garden at the other end of the square. This has been a fascinating project and now near completion it really does look fantastic. My memory of this will be one of our volunteers articulating beautifully how we needed to create 'undulations'.

Our very first Log Pile

"There are now seven log piles and four planters being maintained by a team of enthusiastic volunteers. Log piles mimic dead and fallen trees, providing a habitat for insects and a wealth of wildlife.

Log piles and planters generally look after themselves but require weeding, deadheading and trimming surrounding grass, and occasionally topping up with seasonal plants.

Most of the plants chosen are evergreen perennials, which provide all year round interest—and keep the financial director happy!

PLANT & CAKE SALE

On a Saturday morning in May 2022 we held a plant sale in the Square and sold home made cakes and tea and coffee; we knew that we were coming to the end of the HLF funding and needed additional funds to continue to add to the planting in the Square. The sun shone and Friends generously provided vegetable seedlings, herbaceous plants from their gardens and amazing house plants; most were sold and together with the sale of refreshments (and some donations) we raised £770. We hope to do it again in 2023, as though plant sales are popular in Penarth it was also a good opportunity for us to show off our work in the Square and socialise with those who use it.

Other events held on the Square - Big Jubilee Lunch Sat 4th June - The long weekend celebration for our late Queen's Platinum Jubilee included our now annual Eden Project Big Lunch. Although the weather was cooler than we would have liked, it remained dry and we were able to put out the bunting, lay our blankets on the ground and mark this special occasion with some fizzy drinks. With a great mix of ages – from 9 months to 92 years – there was a family feel to this important community celebration.

Unfortunately our Ghost Trail scheduled for Nov 2nd had to be cancelled due to bad weather. We hopefully will be able to re-schedule the event in December.

ENGAGING WITH THE WIDER COMMUNITY

The most significant example of connecting with the wider community is the increase in membership, which now stands at around 140 members. At events we are regularly supported by approximately 50 people. Our volunteer group now comprises approximately 25 people, with a regular weekly turnout of 12 or more volunteers.

MAKING THE FACILITIES OF THE SQUARE AVAILABLE TO OTHERS

We have held a number of BUG HUNTS on the Square and this Summer Victoria School sent 3 groups of 20 pupils with their teacher to enjoy a mini beast hunt. Bug Hunts were aligned to the school curriculum and aimed at enhancing awareness of environment, habitat and biodiversity.

We have also accommodated All Saints Church tots group for a bug hunt, and they have already booked a date for next Spring.

The Sunday School group of All Saints church have a dedicated area on the Square for planting.

We hope to strengthen these connections during 2023 and will look to engage with more schools and groups .

SUSTAINABILTY & PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

By Spring of 2023 the very last Heritage Lottery and Welsh Governmentt grant funded element will be implemented. Our plans at this stage are to ensure that all of the improvements made to the Square over the last two years can be maintained for the enjoyment of all. We do have a very strong volunteer base and are confident that with their support this can be achieved.

In the immediate future we will not be looking for additional grant funds for capital expenditure. However, we will of course find it necessary to generate funds to sustain the group and Square. With this goal in mind we have already ,during 2022 , made a start with fund raising. We have held very successful plant and cake sales and have had some very generous donations for two dedicated benches. We will continue to look to raise funds from future events, and look forward to your continuing support .
