Project Update - What's been happening on the Square Since our last news letter in December volunteer work on the Square has been very much focused on maintenance and general tidying of the area. Strong winds during January resulted in a number of branches being torn down, creating a good stock for replenishing the deadwood hedge. During this period a large oak near the church halls unfortunately succumbed to the storms. Volunteers are now creating a large log pile around the remaining stump and roots and this will be planted up during the next few weeks..

Apart from general maintenance we have created a much larger mini-pond area, made improvements to the rain garden with additional plants and made the area much larger. We will shortly be increasing the size of the three smaller wildflower areas during April.

We wanted to add some native hedging to the Square to promote bird habitats and thanks to a donation of hedging whips from the Vale Local Nature Partnership we have been able to do so. We have already planted a semi-circular hedge near the yew tree that we de-brambled last winter and 3 clumps of hedging near to Victoria Road. We have further hedging available and are considering where else in the Square to plant them, to enhance its appearance and promote wildlife. We have planted dog-rose, damson, Welsh apple, blackthorn and hawthorn.

Stop Press We are pleased to report news of the imminent arrival and planting of 3 "cut leaf" Alder trees kindly provided by Vale Council. These fine specimens prefer boggy soil conditions and will be ideally suited to the wet area on the east side of the Square facing Victoria Road.



Work continues with Log Piles - (our 1st log pile right)

Log piles mimic dead and fallen trees and provide a habitat for a variety of wildlife. They are a major feature of the Square attracting very positive comments from visitors. Volunteers are constantly maintaining these features by weeding and adding seasonal plants as and when necessary. Pictured right is the very first log pile created, which has now matured to be one of the most attractive on the Square. A foretaste of things to come when later established log piles and planters mature.

Gravel garden - Verbena Bonariensis, Blue and white agapanthus, Salvia of any kind, bergenia both pink and white, Iris Unguicularis, Sedum especially pink leaved

Rain Garden - Persicara bistorta, pink and red, Lysmachia, Ligularia The Rocket, Canna lilies, Gunnera Rogerisia

Water on Victoria Square During 2022 we installed, in collaboration with All Saints Church, a 2000 litre water butt. This natural source of water was an extremely important addition to our water supply enabling us to maintain plants and young trees recently introduced to the Square. However, during long dry spells our current water sources are unable to provide sufficient water, especially to young trees and plants. We are currently considering a number of options and are discussing these with church authorities and Vale Council. We will hopefully be able to update you on any progress in our next News Letter.

Working with Schools and Local Groups As the improvements we have made to the Square have matured it has made the space an ideal venue for people to appreciate and learn about local nature. During 2022 we hosted a number of children's groups and schools in the Square. We have already agreed dates for 2023 with two local schools and will hope to be able to offer activities on the Square to other schools and groups during this coming year.

PROJECT GIANT "Project Giant" is the planting of 10 Sequoia Giant Redwoods in Penarth as a statement of intent to galvanise and maximise our efforts in relation to climate change. The project is led by our good friends Penny Daw, of Penarth Tree Forum and Jon Greatrex of Vale Council. The young trees have been acquired through donations from Penarth Tree Forum Volunteers (almost £2,000) with the intention to plant them in suitable locations across the town... including a splendid avenue of 5 Giants in Alexandra Park. We were hoping to provide a home for one lovely specimen in the Square but alas our ground analysis indicated it just wouldn't be suitable. However we are now in discussion with Stanwell School with the hope of finding a suitable location in the school grounds for two Giant Redwoods. The School has been awarded "Platinum Eco School" status and is keen to work with us to find the right spot and to develop a management plan for their ongoing care. Fingers crossed!

Tree Identification We are very proud of our fine and varied trees throughout the Square. Through the course of the year we will develop a project to provide specimen name tags and information for a number of our key specimens – we'll be looking to use QR codes and other digital media as well as pyrography pens and various tools and materials.
